With an intense schedule Monday, December 19th the day began with a 6:00am wakeup call followed by breakfast and a 2-hour trip to Touba. Prior to arriving in Touba, there was a short stop for a brief welcome reception by the Ministry of Tourism in the new

Then the delegation proceeded to **Touba** and was hosted by Serigne (Sheikh) Mountakha Bachir Mbacké (Khalife General of the Mouride brotherhood). Upon arrival, the delegates were received by a series of local press, national press and several camera men to document and create digital content throughout the week. Several interviews of delegate members were captured and broadcasted live via social media and satellite TV.

The delegates were well received by the community and learned the history of the Mouride community and our shared values of "do for self." Delegates were then greeted



by their welcome reception and received by the wife of the Khalifa for a lunch. Lastly, the Delegates were presented to the Sheikh by Bachirou SECK and remained for comments and prayers as the press



conducted interviews and visits to the Grand Mosque.

Tuesday, December 20th was a special day



as we prepared for and visited **Goree Island** to witness the history of the Transatlantic slave trade. Our tour guide gave a description of the brutal conditions of the slave house and the significance of the "Door of No Return." We stood in the walls of where our ancestors were beaten, raped, murdered, punished and sold in the most inhumane way. Despite the solemn stories and images of the slave trade, we enjoyed the local vendors, an amazing lunch and the beautiful ferry ride to and from the island.

Located on the outskirts of **Mbodiene**, we were greeted by a traditional ceremony of drummers, dancers, singers, music and food. We toured the facility and was hosted for lunch. We witnessed Akon sharing his vision for Akon City and the developments to come.
